Big Orange Attack! CentriKid would not be the same without the one and only Orange Team! So, we want to explain some ways that the Orange Team can help out while at camp.

At CentriKid, our staff are trained and equipped to lead all aspects of camp, including Bible Study, Recreation, Track Times, and more. But there are some instances where we ask for some help from adults like you!

In Bible Study and Track Times, a few extra hands really help enhance the experience for campers. We want to be clear - Orange Team will not be asked to lead anything or to be in charge, but instead to assist the CentriKid Staffer. There are many different ways this can look, but feel free to ask the staffer the best ways you can help them based on your comfort and experience level. Below are some examples of what this could look like.

How would Orange Team help in Bible Study?

Bible Study is a time for campers to dig into God's Word with other campers their same age! In Bible Study, Orange Team Volunteers would assist in things like passing out and cleaning up supplies and equipment for activities, classroom management, helping campers find specific passages in Scripture, and helping campers pay attention to the staffer leading their group. They would also assist in transitioning campers from activity to activity.

How would Orange Team help in Track Times?

Track Times are one of campers' favorite parts of camp! The options vary greatly, but they tend to be broken down into a few different categories: sport tracks, indoor tracks, and outdoor tracks.



Helping in sport tracks may consist of things like:

- Rebounding shots in Basketball
- Throwing footballs to campers as they run routes in Flag Football
- Pitching during Wiffle Ball
- Collecting the bases after Kickball Mania is over
- Providing support for the staffer leading the Track Time and transitioning campers from activity to activity

Helping in indoor tracks may consist of things like:

- Passing out plates and bowls for Weird Science
- Pouring paint into cups for campers in Art Studio
- Tying beaded bracelets for campers in No Boys Allowed
- Helping with clean-up activities once they are complete
- Providing support for the staffer leading the Track Time and transitioning campers from activity to activity

Helping in outdoor tracks may consist of things like:

- Collecting dodgeballs that were thrown out of the playing area
- Refilling buckets of water in H2O Yeah!
- Making sure that campers are following safety protocols in Archery
- Keeping an eye on campers as they walk to the water tent
- Providing support for the staffer leading the Track Time and transitioning campers from activity to activity

Wait, what about OMC?

We never thought you would ask!?! Just kidding, we knew you would because OMC is everyone's favorite game! 😊

There will be many different ways to help out at OMC, and your Camp Director will go over them in much more detail when you are at camp. So for now, let's just say, get ready for the best game of your life!
